- 4 new members of the city's management team have been hired since January 2021.
- Work on Chehalis Avenue between 3rd and 9th Street will begin soon working on water and sewer. Work will be starting soon on National Avenue as well.
- The Building and Planning Department is working on processes to streamline development.
 Backlog is getting processed
- A new carwash being located on Louisiana Ave. should be open this summer.
- Honda will resume their filling on Louisiana Ave soon as well.
- Large construction project continues at Greenhill.
- Recreation Park continues to be vandalized by area youth. The city has cameras installed and is working with the Chehalis School District to catch the criminals.
- With a new grant received by the Parks & Rec Dept, a new Movies in the Park program will be happening this summer.
