Jenny Collins, Chehalis Foundation

- Communication wall will be installed at Penny Playground for non-verbal communication
- Estimated \$700,000 of additional revenue generated by the baseball fields and playground.
- Current projects:
 - o Returfing the WF West baseball field
 - Tennis facility at 0 Bishop Road. The cost of this project has almost doubled due to high construction costs.
- Student Achievement Initiative:
 - 96% of WF West seniors graduated last year
 - 100% applied to college
 - o 74% of grads are college ready, a percentage well exceeding the state average.
- Upcoming events:
 - Gala will be held November 19th at Jester Auto Museum.

Chris Judd, United Way of Lewis County

- Chris recently joined United Way of LC and his main role is fundraising for the organization
- Current Initiatives include:
 - Lifting 30% out of poverty by 2030 by focusing on education
 - United Learning Center project in Centralia is also seeing increasing construction costs
 - Reading Buddies program reinstated that will bring volunteers into schools to read with K-3rd graders in school districts across the county.
 - Sheriff Snaza has stated that reading rates at 3rd grade are an indicator of jail beds needed in the future
 - The Affinity Group, Women United has started the Supplies Period program that aims to reduce/eliminate period poverty by providing supplies to the schools.
 - Lewis County has one of the worst FAFSA completion rates in the state. United Way is working with partners to offer help to seniors complete the form.
 - Fundraising event will be held October 22 featuring a country concert with Aaron Crawford at the Chehalis Theater.

Naomi Robb, Kiddin' Around

- Kiddin' Around is a non-profit based in Centralia with the purpose of providing free activities for families. They have hosted many events including a school supply drive. They have a board of 6 people, and meet every 2 weeks
- They will host Literacy Day on Oct 1st. More information coming soon on their website.
- They are refreshing/bringing back the popular Business Week program held at Centralia College for Chehalis and Centralia students.
- They are starting a youth board program placing high school students on non-profit boards in Lewis County
- In March they will host an adult dodgeball event.

- ChehalisFest was a success. Many businesses report increased traffic and there was a good turnout even though it was extremely hot.
- Postcard program is still in process.
- Updating kiosk maps around town and adding a new map at Stan Headwall's RV Park.

Laura Six, Economic Vitality

- Year to date we have provided 12 grants totaling \$22,000 and project total of \$43,000.
- 3 grants in the past 2 weeks.

- Utility box at Main Street and Chehalis Avenue has been painted by Irisa Kennedy.
- Palmer Lumber's building on Prindle Street has 2 candidates and the business is making final decisions.
