Lindsey Senter - Port of Chehalis

• The grain storage facility project has been funded by the federal government with support from Representative Glusenkamp-Perez. The project will give the local agriculture industry increased options for crop storage wise which can provide far reaching impacts. The budget for the project is about \$5.4 million and includes an 8-acre transportation loading facility. The project allows for future build-outs of the facility.

The project could be a starting point for many other complimentary projects including farm-to-table restaurants, breweries, or fertilizer facilities.

- The Port is also working on a creek project. There are culvert projects to be accomplished that are unfunded state requirement for fish passage.
- The Port leases unused land to farmers to work the land, allowing the farmers to profit from their crops without owning the land.
- A small grant was recently used to purchase a rail pusher in partnership with the college who was involved in setting up the new machine.

ChehalisFest was a huge success by all accounts! The car show had 129 entries, 30 more than 2022. The vendor fair grew as well with more vendors placed on Pacific Avenue this year. The LC Historical Museum served a record number of breakfasts. Local businesses on Market Boulevard commented that they had their best day of sales this year, and that the festival reminded them of the former days of the Krazy Days summer festival in the 1980's.

Jessica managed an expanded Experience Chehalis tent offering swag including stickers, buttons, coloring books, etc. T-shirts and hats were offered for sale and did well for our first attempt selling merchandise at an event.
