Jill Anderson, City of Chehalis Update

- Downtown Revitalization
 - The city is currently in negotiations with HBB to do the planning and design work for a downtown revitalization project for Market Boulevard, Boistfort Street and surrounding Washington Ave and Pacific Ave.
 - Once the plan is complete, the city will work to secure grants to raise funding
 - The city is replacing burned out street lights downtown with LED streetlights.
- The city has allocated a \$75,000 in the budget to support Experience Chehalis through a 2024 B&O tax donation
- There is a South Chehalis UGA planning meeting December 4th at 6pm in the council chambers.
- There is currently an open city council position. Anyone interested in applying can contact Chehalis City Hall.

Bill Duetscher, Chehalis Centralia Railroad & Museum

- The railroad has sold 6,000 tickets to the Polar Express bringing in more than \$400,000. Rides are sold out for the 2023 season.
- According to data collected 80% of the customers travel from over 25 miles away.
- They purchase cookies and beverages for the riders from local businesses including Northwest Cookie Co. and L&E Bottling.
- Over 25 dedicated volunteers are involved in producing the Polar Express rides each year.

• The Experience Chehalis website is being refreshed with new content and several new additions.

- The historic walking tour will soon be reprinted and an online version will be available. Plaques will be placed under the existing walking tour plaques with a QR code to take visitors to the website guiding visitors.
- The email e-newsletter has been reformatted and will be launched each month with the help of new volunteer, Jenny Zenkner.
- Ladies Night on November 11 was a big success. This event featured two successful vendor fairs and many local businesses joined in the festivities. The next event will be in March 2024.

- Holiday Festivities

 - The Bartels building has a new tenant that will be opening an artisan market and café.
 - M&K's corner space is being converted to an organic juice bar.
