Partner Updates

Joe Clark - Lewis County Transit

- Lewis County Transit is leasing the former adult store property next to the Park N Ride off Exit 77. They have received \$380K from the state for funding the development of the property as an enhanced visitor area. They would like to find another \$2 million to fully expand the project. The \$380K grant money will fund a lane for a bus pickup in the parking lot. Phase 2 would include additional parking, and Phase 3 would add another parking lot.
- Napavine service will begin in spring of 2025.
- A \$275K grant applied for with create a sidewalk from Lewis County Coffee to the Boys and Girls Club; a route with heavy use.

Mary Kay Nelson - Chehalis Centralia Railroad

- Pumpkin Trains will run October 19 and 20.
- Polar Express will bring 6,000 people this winter and 80% are from out of the area. There will be a total of 54 runs. It is a trademarked event and the railroad has rights by way of royalties. 30% of revenue goes to Warner Bros. Staff attend training camps earlier in the year to learn more about putting on the event.
- The organization has worked very hard to build a more strategic board. They are working on deferred maintenance. They are still waiting on FEMA funding from the January 2022 flood. The organization has replaced the Sterns Creek Bridge, a \$100k project as well as replaced 500-1000 railroad ties, another \$100k project.
- Rail bikes are coming in October via the company Joy Rails.
- In order to increase profitability, the train has located a car in Snoqualmie. They will trade a turntable for this car. They have received a \$50k pledge to renovate the new car.

- The Imagine Downtown Chehalis project continues and the next open house will be in January.
- A new mural has been installed at the library, called "Nature's Library." The mural celebration gala hosted with the Chehalis Timberland Library was a great success.
- We had our annual Main Street visit from the state program. They encouraged our program to apply for national main street designation. The visit was very positive and encouraging.
- Several board members will be attending the PLACES state Main Street conference in Walla Walla next week.
